RE: Alberta Law Reform Institute Survey

Dear Practitioner.

On behalf of the Chair of STEP Calgary, Ruth Spetz, and the Chair of STEP Edmonton, Chris Turnbull, please find below a link to a survey about the Dower Act compiled by the Alberta Law Reform Institute (ALRI).

ALRI has identified several issues including the exclusion of Adult Interdependent Partners (common-law partners) and outdated language. The Act has not seen any significant changes since 1948.

ALRI is looking for early input into the project, which will help them identify other issues. At this stage, they are looking to hear from lawyers and other professionals who regularly encounter dower rights in their work, specifically, any practical challenges or complications that arise because of dower rights.

STEP members are invited to share the survey link with colleagues or other professionals they work with. ALRI would be glad to get responses from real estate agents, mortgage brokers, financial planners, estate and trust managers, trustees-in-bankruptcy, and others.

In addition to the survey, ALRI is also scheduling telephone interviews with practitioners can share their experience and perspectives on the Dower Act. Anyone who is interested in participating can sign up through the survey.

It is anticipated that ALRI will publish a Report for Discussion on the Dower Act in early spring 2021.
