RE: STEP Vulnerable Client Symposium Final Report

On March 8, 2021 STEP Canada's Public Policy Committee hosted a virtual invitation only symposium to start a cross sector conversation on the issues, barriers, and opportunities to better serve and support vulnerable clients. Seventy-nine leaders and professionals who have devoted their energies to preventing, recognizing, and responding to the abuse and mistreatment of vulnerable people had candid conversations about the challenges and the need to collaborate to support systemic change. Delegates reinforced the importance of these types of cross sector discussions and the need for both professional and public education.

This Report summarizes the event. It documents what was heard, and the ideas generated, including suggestions for STEP Canada. It includes a list of resources generated from the participants that all practitioners will find useful. STEP Canada is now in the process of identifying and prioritizing the strategies and activities that STEP Canada can pursue to help advance these ideas.
